Summary of Individual Consultations

Joan Prival, Lead Program Director of Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program, Division of Undergraduate Education (DUE), NSF

- They receive 150 proposals each year, and have a 33% success rate.
- Next deadline is 3/5/14.
- There's a Phase II opportunity if the current grant is ending in 2014, even if there's a no-cost extension.
 - o Can go another 5 years.
 - o Can get money for new teachers, mentors, scholarships
- Second option is to have no new scholarships, but collect more data.
 - o Limited to \$300K
- Any evaluations require IRB approval.
- Regarding IUSE, she is not sure of future of the program. There may be changes. 2/4/14 is the deadline target. May be able to submit past the deadline. There will be funding decisions over the summer.

Adam Parris, Program Manager, Regional Integrated Sciences & Assessment, Climate Program Office, NOAA

- He described several funding opportunities:
 - Coastal Ocean Climate Applications (COCA): For example, fisheries managers can team with HSU to study climate impacts.
 - o Regional Integrated Sciences and Assessments (RISA): Supports interstate research on climate issues. Scripps is doing a 5-year study of the effects of sea level rise.
 - o Sectoral Applications Research Program (SARP): Supports research on water issues.
 - \$100-300K for 1-3 years.
 - Released sometime from May to July
 - Collaboration encouraged
- 16% success rate

Dara Blachman-Demner, Social Science Analyst, US Department of Justice

- She said Violence against Women funding is solid.
- She suggested talking with the program officer to find out if a project is within the scope of a program.
- Funding for Violence and Victimization Research Division ranges from \$300-600K for 2-3 years, on average.
